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"From the Inside Out"

Art Show on Santa Fe of Florence Crittenton Students' Work

DENVER – March 5, 2010 – The Alpine Fine Art Center in the Santa Fe Arts District is hosting an exhibit of art created by students attending the Florence Crittenton School, operated by Parent Pathways, from March 19 through 27.

The gallery will be showcasing students' "Self Boxes," created under the guidance of Art Therapist Beth Erlander, in an interpretive show entitled "From the Inside Out."

Parent Pathways' Florence Crittenton School is a DPS alternative school serving pregnant and parenting teens, many of them from at-risk backgrounds. During Erlander's self-box project, students are asked to select two boxes, one to represent them and one to represent their baby, their deepest secret, or something really precious to them. On the outside of their box, they depict the way they think the world sees them or the parts that they show the world. The inside is devoted to who they think they really are.
